







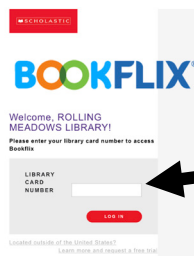

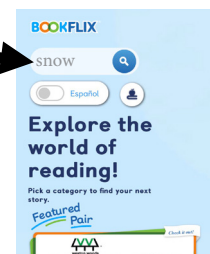

# Snowy Adventures

## SNOWY OWL CRAFT

### You'll Need:

two small dessert-size paper plates  
white paper (construction paper is best)  
markers or crayons  
glue and Scissors



### Instructions:

1. Start by cutting one of the paper plates in half for the wings
2. Tear the white paper into pieces of different sizes. These will be the feathers.
3. Glue the pieces of paper to the two half plates.
4. Glue the wings underneath the other paper plate
5. Draw the eyes and beak on the owl. See the picture for a reference.
