We're excited to announce a new enhancement coming to the library this fall and introduce a new way to connect you with books you'll love.

OUR CATALOG IS EXPANDING THIS FALL!

We're pleased to share that the Rolling Meadows Library has received a \$53,000 grant from the Reaching Across Illinois Library System. This funding supports our transition to a state-of-the-art shared library catalog scheduled to launch in October 2026. The new catalog will connect us with a consortium of public libraries across the northern suburbs, expanding access to materials from our current collection of about 185,000 items to more than 5 million. We'll share more details as the launch approaches.

LAUNCHING OUR SUBSCRIPTION BOX FOR ALL AGES

We're launching the *Book Match Subscription Box* (details below), a personalized reading service for patrons of all ages. Simply tell us about your interests, favorite genres, and reading preferences, and our librarians will curate a selection of books just for you.
