Let's say the rhyme all over again.


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Five potato, six potato, seven potato, more.

You will find the printable craft and instructions on page 3. If you prefer, come to the library and we will give you a packet of this Rhyme Time Tuesdays activities to take home.











Markers or Crayons Glue Scissors Popsicle stick (optional)

Instructions:

- 1. Print pages 3 and 4.

- 4. Glue the eyes, mouth and nose to the potato head.
- 5. You can glue the potato to a Popsicle stick (optional)
