- a paper plate
- markers, crayons or colored pencils
- scissors
- glue or tape
- leaves

Cozy Hibernating Bear



Directions:


1. Print this page and color the sleeping bear at the bottom of the page. Cut out your bear.
2. Cut your paper plate in half.



3. Cut out the half circle in the center of one of the halves.



4. Color the front of the full half plate a dark color for the inside of the cave.



5. Color the back side of the curved part of the plate gray or silver for the outside of the cave.



6. Tape or glue your bear onto the black inside of your cave.



7. Tape or glue the curved part of the plate to the front of the cave.



8. Decorate the inside and outside of your bear cave with leaves you've collected from outside or make some out of paper.
